



CALL FOR MEMBERSHIP

Uganda Youth Network (UYONET) is the leading national youth organization that works to mainstream young people's engagement in development and governance processes in Uganda and East Africa. The organization is comprised of 25 youth focused networks and about 117 member organizations working with young people across the country. Over the years, UYONET has built and sustained partnerships with a cross section of non-state agencies, government, extensive media partnerships and regional bodies and has always played a strategic role in empowering youth leaders in politics, civil society and other sectors; equipping them with skills that enable them advocate effectively on issues affecting them.

Vision: A peaceful and prosperous society, led by an accountable governance system

Mission: To build, empower and sustain a vibrant youth movement that fosters sustainable economic development and champions' accountable governance.

UYONET is implementing its 10 year strategy (2018-2028) that envisions a strong youth movement with the capability, initiative and the drive for national socio- economic and democratic transformation. As a membership organization; the power and strength of the network is vested in its membership and therefore the stronger the membership, the stronger the network and reciprocally. Our reach has expanded gradually and grown into a bigger and stronger nationally and internationally recognized youth agency seeking to mainstream young people's engagement in governance and development processes.

In the new UYONET membership model, we aim at bringing on board a number of categories of youth formations including; Youth in faith based organizations, Youth led and focused NGOs and CBOs, Youth in sports clubs, Youth in cultural institutions, Youth in the informal sector, Youth clubs in schools and institutions, Youth in professional bodies and the National Youth Council. The above is premised on the assumption that by 2028, at least 70% of UYONET's program implementation would be through the membership and secretariat would play more of an execution and coordination role.

Uganda Youth network has expanded its Programme implementation to over 45 districts in the country and has thus once again opened up recruitment to vibrant youth focused and youth led organizations who can creatively contribute the achievement of the strategic objectives as per the 2018- 2028 strategy.
